President's Corner By Bill Inglis

Dear FCAers,

Well, your President has been a busy guy this last month along with three other Club members. I flew to the Cavallino Classic in West Palm Beach, Florida January 24, 2003. The purpose was to take a look at the quality of the cars at the Ferrari Concours held at the Breakers Hotel. The quality of the cars appeared to be of Pebble Beach quality and were limited to about 120 entrants. The grounds of the Breakers Hotel is a Golf Course and the Concours takes part on the course which is not unlike Pebble Beach in Monterey.

Wally Clark's article in this Sempre Ferrari details the Cavallino event. My impression of the Breakers Hotel is that it is a must see for anyone visiting South Florida. We were sitting in a dining room eating breakfast one morning, looking up at Flying Buttresses 50 feet above our heads, truly a monument to architecture and beauty. It was like eating in Westminster Abbey. We flew into Ft. Lauderdale and drove up Highway 1A, which on one side is the Atlantic Ocean and on the other side are private homes. We drove for hour solid on this 2-lane highway and never saw a home under 5,000 square feet and many of them in excess of 15,000 to 20,000 square feet. The wealth in America is truly staggering when you visit an area like this, especially when you consider that these homes are second homes and not places of primary residence for the wealthy owners.

On March 1st, I flew to Orlando, Florida for the Ferrari Club of America National Board Meeting. It was a very good meeting and all 16 regions in attendance. A number of items were discussed, one of which being that would the Southwest Region like to host another annual meeting in the year 2011. Another topic of discussion was the national membership survey being completed. It is very interesting that this survey, on a national basis, mirrors almost exactly what is happening here in Southern California. 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

F2003-GA new Ferrari F1 racer

The chassis is new, both in terms of design and construction saving weight and improving structure over the previous F2002 chassis. The bodywork, radiators, exhausts and the rear end have been redesigned, leading to a further increase in aerodynamic performance. The mechanically operated power steering is also a new design. The front and rear suspension elements have been revised, to maximise the performance of the Bridgestone tires and to improve the efficiency of the aerodynamic package. New materials have been introduced to reduce the weight and size of the engine and transmission. Like its predecessor, the new 052 engine is loadbearing and is mounted longitudinally. As usual, Shell made a significant contribution to the evolution of the 052, both in terms of fuels and lubricants, to ensure maximum performance and reliability.

While maintaining the same position and longitudinal mounting, the gearbox is completely a new design, achieving both a reduction in dimensions and weight. The gearbox is cast in titanium with seven speeds (plus reverse) and is electro-hydraulically operated with a sequential shift.

In keeping with a trend initiated by Ferrari and now almost universally adopted in F1, the car is fitted with a high level exhaust system, the same layout as seen on the F2002.

The car's center of gravity is lower than that of its predecessor, producing a further improvement in weight distribution for both chassis and engine. Ferrari believes that with the F2003-GA we have taken a further step forward maximising the performance of innovative materials and design whilst utilising advanced quality control techniques and philosophies to ensure safety and reliability. **SF**




Have you ever had the desire to update the interior of your Ferrari but were worried about changing the way "Enzo intended it to be?"

If so one option may be to update the interior with an item that "Enzo intended," just not for your particular model Ferrari.

Specifically I'm talking about the pedals in your Ferrari. The latest creations from Ferrari have included aluminum drilled pedals for years, which in my opinion greatly enhances the interior of the Ferrari from multiple perspectives.

One perspective is looks. The pedals look great in the car as opposed to the ordinary rubber covers that originally came with the car.

Another perspective is functionality. The brake and clutch pedals have an anti slip surface finish which will enhance the grip between your foot and the pedal, even if the sole of your shoe is wet. Additionally, the aluminum gas pedal can be modified to include a short extension along the lower left corner to allow even a novice to heel/toe like a professional.



Drilling into the original pedals is required to securely fasten the aluminum pedals in place. Simply re-install the original rubber brake and clutch pedal covers to hide the 1/4" mounting holes, which leaves only the two 1/4" mounting holes in the gas pedal exposed.

In order to make this desire a reality you have a few options.

One option is to purchase a set of aluminum pedals from your local Ferrari dealer. Installation may require some modification, depending on which car the pedals were originally designed for and which car your

are installing them into.

Another option is to purchase an aftermarket set that is designed for your particular application. The benefits of this are you get a pedal that uses the same material and manufacturing methods, that requires no modification, and costs a fraction of the price for the factory original pedals.

The new Ferrari, which will be unveiled at the Geneva Motorshow will be called the "Challenge Stradale." It joins the 360 Modena and the 360 Spider in the Ferrari 8 cylinder range of road cars.

The Challenge Stradale derives from the latest interpretation of the pure Ferrari tradition of making road cars directly derived from the race cars. With the Challenge Stradale, the racing expertise comes from the Ferrari Challenge International Championships and the FIA GT races, where the 360 Challenge and 360 GT models are top protagonists, both in Europe and in the United States.

The Ferrari Challenge Stradale's racing roots can been seen in the fact it is much lighter, thanks mainly to a stripped-out racing finish, as well as significant modifications to the aerodynamics, set-up, brakes and the use of an F1-style gearchange.

The engine is the 3,586cc V8, with five valves per cylinder and titanium connecting rods, which secured a worldwide success for the 360 Modena and the 360 Spider. The chassis and bodywork are made entirely from aluminium as designed and used by Ferrari in the 360 Modena.


The color of the car on the Ferrari stand in Geneva will be the new "Rosso Scuderia," the same red of the Formula 1 cars, with decorations recalling Ferraris used in customer races of the past.

Ferrari Challenge Pirelli Trophy is a one make series for semi-professional and amateur racers. It was set up by Ferrari in 1993 to give Cavallino owners the chance to drive their Ferraris on the track, going up against other enthusiasts, in teams set up by various Ferrari dealers from around the world.

The first car to be used was the Ferrari 348, followed in 1995 by the F355. The 2000 season saw the 360 Modena Challenge make its debut, fitted with an 8 cylinder engine putting out over 400 horsepower. It ran alongside the F355. From 2002, only the 360 Challenge was eligible for the series.

The Ferrari Challenge Pirelli Trophy is divided into three international series – the Ferrari Challenge Italia, the Ferrari Challenge Europa and the Ferrari Challenge USA, with around 120 drivers taking part. Each season ends with the International Finals, which sees drivers and teams from all three championships come together to race. **SF** Information and image courtesy Ferrari SpA

It started to rain after lunch, so we left so we could catch our plane back to LA. We should do it again next year! SF

not incur the same losses as 2002. Another item on the membership was that you may renew your membership with the Ferrari Club of America either by phone or email. A couple things that appeared to be of interest in the Ferrari Membership Survey is that people like mystery drives, whereby you arrive at a pre-determined place and only at that time do you either get a map or perhaps no map and just follow the car in front of you for a 50 to 70 mile drive to a restaurant where everybody pays separately for their lunch. It makes sense and maybe, it is something we should look into.

On the legal side, it is reported that we have to have a waiver signed on any kind of driving event. In other words, if we meet at a pre-conceived location and drive together to a restaurant or a venue of any type, we have to have waivers signed by not only the driver but also the passenger. One of the biggest discussions, which took over an 1 hour and a final vote, was regarding the Maserati relationship with of the Ferrari Club of America on a national level. 


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
