



8th Annual Pacific Palisades Auto Show

Event honors our remembered friend Marshall Leib.

In 1996 the Pacific Palisades Chamber of Commerce was looking for a new fund-raising event. An event that would involve merchants and the community. A merchant in the Palisades suggested

talking to a friend who just happened to be involved in promoting Auto Shows. His name was Marshall Leib. With some skepticism, and absolutely no knowledge of such an event, the Board of Directors invited Marshall to a meeting. In his usual fashionable attire and looking very much the successful promoter and organizer. He presented his case how he could bring an Auto Show to the Palisades. The Chamber would raise money and the Community would have a good time! Thus, the Ferrari Show was christened. It was a fairly simple show with 50-75 Ferraris and was held on both sides of the street

of North Swarthmore. There were a few booths, some food and about 7,000 people in attendance.

In 1997 Merecedes-Benz sponsored the 2nd Annual Auto Show, which included Studebakers and Packards. 1998 brought the Ferrari Club back and then in 1999, a committee member, Earl Gandel approached Lexus and asked if they would be interested in sponsoring our show. Lexus Santa Monica has continued for the past five years to sponsor the annual Pacific Palisades Auto Show. Under Lexus sponsorship, the committee has been able to branch out and change the venue of the show to Hot Rods, Classics and feature supreme autos from the past. The current shows now attract up to 300 auto exhibitors, 20 product booths, food, music, face painters, games and approximately 20,000 attendees of all ages.

Marshall Leib introduced the committee to the Petersen Automotive Museum, which has been our chosen charity for three years, along with a Pacific Palisades charity. Marshall was always looking to the future, Were not for Marshall, the Auto Show would most probably not have arrived in Pacific Palisades. Marshall Leib was our coach, advisor, mentor and friend. He will be truly missed. Thank you, Marshall, for your help, expertise, guidance, leg work and friendship in showing the Pacific Palisades Auto Show Committee just how it should be done.

We are forever grateful.

To Know Him, Is To Him, and I Do and I Do.

If you hummed or sung the above lyrics you were singing along with The Teddy Bears (Marshall Leib, Harvey Goldstein and Annette Kleinbard later known as Carol Conners 1958).

Marshall and Phil Spector (noted producer and songwriter of *To Know Him Was To Love Him*) were friends from Burroughs Junior High School and Fairfax High in Los Angeles, California.

Marshall was a tall, handsome, tanned nineteen-yearold student who had been active in sports in high school and college. He was attending Los Angeles City College, and majoring in business and law when Phil contacted him. Marshall had some experience in the music business, having formed the Moondogs with classmates in 1958 and he and Phil shared a love for Rock and Roll music.

Another student at Los Angeles City College, Harvey Goldstein, contributed \$10 to the group after being promised he could sing bass. Annette Kleinbard, was a 16 year old at Fairfax High when asked to join the group. Dore Records was approached and during negations in their office, the group came up with the name The Teddy Bears (after the hit song by Elvis Presley.)

Spector coaxed Annette and Marshall to record *To Know Him Is To Love Him.* Dore mailed 500 copies of the single to radio stations in early August 1958. In September, a disc jockey in Fargo, North Dakota, began playing *To Know Him Is To Love Him* and a distributor in Minneapolis requested 18 thousand copies! Within a week the record was on the national charts.

The Teddy Bears appeared on American Bandstand in October and *To Know Him Is To Love Him* became a number one record, selling more than a million copies before Christmas.

Marshall became a musician and promoter for, among others, the Everly Brothers. They toured together and remained friends for over 40 years.

Marshall died March 15, 2002. Those of us who are involved with the Pacific Palisades Chamber of Commerce Auto Show remember him as a dedicated teacher and promoter for the Pacific Palisades Auto Show. we owe it to Marshall Leib's knowledge, his kindness, and his friendship. **SF**

FBH President Giacomo Mattioli's Challenge Stradale presentation celebrated the West Coast premiere of this continuation of Ferrari GT models with the additional display of the new model's lineage: a 360 Modena, the 360 Challenge 2001 North American champion, the 360 GT 2002 Grand Am Series winner, and the 360F Gumball 3000 Rally participant.

The Challenge Stradale ("Stradale" street in Italian), is a full race car for the street which has been put through a stringent weight reduction to enhance the already impressive performance of the 360. 240 pounds were shaved by deleting the radio, carpets, Perspex slide race-type side windows and carbon fiber trim in the cockpit. The red "Start" button on the central console begs to be pressed to let the fun begin.


Performance and safety upgrades from a 360 Modena include a roll cage, carbon fiber everywhere. Immense Brembo carbon-ceramic composite rotors, shorter titanium springs lower the ride height and save unsprung weight and the engine's horsepower upgrade to 425 hp was achieved by improvements to the combustion chamber, intake and exhaust system refinements. All Stradales will be equipped with the F1-type electro-hydraulic transmission with "auto" removed. **SF**





In Memory - Mr. C

Briggs Swift Cunningham, 96, a renowned competitor in sports car racing and competitive sailing, died July 2, 2003 at his home in Las Vegas from complications of Alzheimer's disease.

From the 1940s to his last race in 1965, Cunningham was a fierce sports car racing competitor who also skippered the Columbia to win the 1958 America's Cup. After winning many road races in the United States, he was the first American to challenge the Europeans in the 24 Hours of Le Mans in 1950.

In 1950 he established an automobile manufacturing and development company to build his own cars to compete with the Europeans. The first Cunningham C-1 was designed around a Cadillac engine. His most successful sports car was the C-4R, which won multiple races in the 1953 and 1954 U.S. racing seasons.

Cunningham's winning designs helped establish American automobiles as credible Le Mans competitors and won the respect of European and American racing enthusiasts. He also established the American racing colors: white body with blue strips down the middle.

Cunningham also set the course for American leadership in the America's Cup yacht racing challenge. In 1958, after a 21-year hiatus of the event, he won the race in the syndicate's 12 meter yacht, "Columbia" which established a winning tradition for American yachts that would last until 1983,

He also played a part in the development of the Chrysler Hemi "300" high-speed engine and all fin- and water-cooled brakes in the 1950s.

After retiring from racing, Cunningham and his wife Laura opened the Cunningham Automotive Museum in Costa Mesa, California, to display his personal collection of automobiles. The museum closed in 1985; the collection of cars was sold to Cunningham's lifelong friend, Miles Collier Jr., who keeps the collection in a private museum in Florida.

With Miles Collier Sr., he formed the Automobile Racing Club of American (ARCA) in 1934. Cunningham was also a founding member of the Sports Car Club of America, and he was member number one (the oldest member) of the New York Yacht Club.

Cunningham was born Jan. 19, 1907 to wealthy Cincinnati financier Briggs Swift Cunningham and his wife Elizabeth Kilgour in Cincinnati, Ohio. The senior Cunningham was the principal financier and part-owner in the ventures of two young partners who developed a bath soap that floats: William Cooper Proctor and James Norris Gamble.

He is survived by his wife of 40 years, Laura, son Briggs III, daughters Lucie McKinney and a number of grand- and great-grandchildren.




