
#### I attended Concorso Italiano, Laguna Seca and Pebble Beach this year. There were many other events going on, but these are the primary attractions for the weekend.

The feature of Laguna Seca this year was the 100th anniversary of Ford. Ford race cars were featured through out the weekend. There was also a Formula 1 reunion of sorts, featuring cars of the 50's and 60's. Famous Ford race cars and drivers abound, and the line to get into the Ford racing tent was long (I never made it!). One of the most interesting displays was that of the vintage Tyrrell race car transporter that has been restored along with a host of Tyrrell Formula One cars, including Sir Jackie Stewart's rides.

Pebble Beach also featured Ford, along with Bugatti. Boy, were there Bugatti's there! I think most of the type 57 production was on the field! The line up of Ford GT 40s had to be seen. There were two classes of Ferraris and the two winners were Jack Thomas' ex-Agnelli 375AM show car, formerly owned by Betz and Peters and now restored. It won the production class. The winner of the competition class was John Mozart's 250TR Fantuzzi spider race car. The overall Best of Show went to, what else, a Bugatti!



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## **Mineral Springs Ride & Drive**

Last Memorial Day weekend marked the running of the 6th annual Mineral Springs Ride and Drive. To review it we return to a time of yesteryear. A time in California when Impressionist painters, were also inspired by our windswept coastlines, majestic mountains, and poppy-strewn fields. Their work flourished from the late 1800's to the style's final days of the 1930's. Painters such as Franz Bishoff, Maurice Braun, John Marshal Gamble, William Jackson, Edgar Payne, Granville Redmond, Guy Rose, William Wendt, and many more, explored the light, color and atmosphere of our state.

California Impressionism was a departure from the painting style of Realism. In comparison, this Ride and Drive event was a departure too, but for us it was from the routine of our daily lives. Yes, from stop and go traffic, congested streets, and the stress of the urban environment. Like the painters we searched for the ultimate California landscape.

In searching for contrast to the typical event Tino Mingori, the originator of this event, and an accomplished painter himself, set out to combine the best Ferrari driving roads and the best California landscape with a brief visit to an inviting spa and resort. This might not seem a challenge, but when you set your goals to establish the route to minimize or eliminate freeway driving, find long stretches of country winding roads with no traffic, and stay at a destination resort within reasonable distance to LA, it is not an easy task. The ultimate result is the combination of vigorous driving and elegant dining at the hotel and winery.




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And then there was Morris Kessler's F40. In 2000 Derek Bell, who was voted "Best Sports car driver of the last 50 years" in 1998, was put on a track with arguably the 10 best "Supercars" available: Ford GT 40, BMW M1, McLaren F1, Porsche 959, Lamborgini Countach, Miura, and an F40. An interesting exercise indeed. After pounding all cars to the limit for a whole day, the choice was clear, if he had to take one home it would be the F40. "This is a car to make your hair curl. The delivery is ferocious. I adore it. Of all the cars here it's the one I really see myself owning. The ferocity of this car's acceleration is mind-blow-ing." "This is a road rocket that could be lethal in the wrong hands so brutal is the slingshot punch once the V8 zings past 3000 RPM." "Or, as Dean Batchlor put it in the 'Ferrari Illustrated Buyer's Guide,' For those who....didn't have the opportunity to fly a jet fighter off an aircraft carrier catapult or land the space shuttle, the F40 is for them. It is the ultimate thrill ride for the land bound enthusiast."

Morris' car had only logged 2100 miles since purchased new in 1992, When he arrived home on Sunday he had logged another 750. One of our goals had been accomplished: get your car out and drive it.

Day two took us to Rancho Sisquoc Winery, one of our all time favorite places. The ranch was part of a 1852 Spanish land grant and includes 37,000 acres where cattle are raised and wine is produced. The San Ramon Chapel overlooking the entrance to the ranch, and also adorns every wine label is a trademark. The place is quiet and takes you back to a time where things were simpler and times went by slower.

Other highlights of the weekend were the Sycamore Mineral Springs Resort with natural sulfur hot springs, the 30 Ferraris, "Dr. Magic the infamous magic man, the wine tasting before dinner, the Richard Cole loop through San Luis Obispo County, the talk by Harold Bratton who was Richie Ginther's personal mechanic. But most of all it was a great group of enthusiasts and a ton of fun.

Like the painters and photographers of past and present we enjoyed the wild flower lined roads through the mountains, canyons, and our spectacular coastline.

The Mineral Springs weekend is a true expression of the Club's Driving Committee's philosophy: Great driving combined with social activities.

We hope you can join us next year. SF


