


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President's Corner by Murray Cogan

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Deferred Maintenance, Deal Killers and Diminishing Returns

Just as we get used to the toll taken by the passage of time, from thinning hair to the mornings aches and pains, owners of older Ferraris have grown accustomed to the idiosyncrasies and weaknesses of their cars.

To these long term owners, the Ferrari they have owned for many years is a great car, starts right up, will go into second gear if you're very smooth and patient and doesn't leak much oil.

Chances are, however, that they have put fewer and fewer miles on their car as time has passed. Often when someone decides to part with a prized Ferrari, it may not have been started or driven for months or years. And just as likely, chances are the new owner, excited by his new toy, wants to start driving now, and as often as he can. And thats where the problems can start. Ferraris, like all cars, age. Anyone buying a 1984 Chevy Impala expects a worn suspension, flaccid shocks, minor engine leaks, a clunking differential, and a/c long overdue for a recharge. For \$2,500 bucks the buyer gets basic transportation.

Someone buying a 1984 Boxer will be spending about \$75,000 yet their new Boxer will have the same inherent age related problems as our hypothetical Chevy Impala does, but... they will cost far more to repair!

Virtually every Ferrari twenty years old needs the shocks rebuilt or replaced; suspension bushings replaced; brake hoses replaced; water pump rebuild; water hoses replaced and an engine reseal because of oil leaks. Simply put, shock absorber seals, suspension bushings, brake hoses, water hoses et al are made of rubber or rubber related components that deteriorate with age. While all of these components are important and the cost of replacement can be used in the price negotiations, reality is that every twenty plus year old Ferrari will have these problems. Unless the problems are safety related, they are negotiation points and not deal killers. We are, after all, talking about a used car, not a restored car.

Common sense and driver preservation dictate that safety related items such as deteriorated brake lines or frozen shocks or brake calipers have to be repaired before the car can be used, and should be factored in at some percentage of the purchase price. I usually recommend to the seller and to the buyers that they reach a percentage split agreement on the estimated cost of repairs. Split agreements work well because the buy-

ers arent nearly as eager to have every aging part on the car replaced if they are paying part of the bill and the sellers are (begrudgingly) paying for long overdue deferred maintenance.

The Ferrari caveat is that it is oh-soeasy to go into the while-youre-at-it mode and while the brakes are off have the calipers re-plated and re-sleeved; while the suspension is apart for a bushing replacement to powder coat or re-plate the suspension arms and while the brake rotors are off being machined its time to powder coat the uprights, replace the wheel bearings, and quickly turn a suspension bushing replacement and basic brake job into a twenty thousand dollar suspension and brake restoration. Simply put it is not the sellers responsibility to provide the buyer with a Platinum winning suspension rebuilt for the Ferrari Club of America National meet under the guise of a brake job and suspension rebuild.

While age related problems are negotiable, deal killers include major crash damage that has been repaired poorly, bent frames that have been repaired badly, or a sick engine that needs an expensive and mandatory engine rebuild.

As a quick example, not so long ago this author sold a one owner, red with black 1984 512 BBi with only 16,000 original miles. This one-owner-from-new Boxer had seen very little use in this past decade, had a near perfect body and paint and ran well. Upon detailed inspection the list of needed repairs was long and included dried out cam belts, water hoses as hard as hockey pucks; flaccid front shocks; a leaky front and rear main seal, a leaky shifter seal and it-ain't-cold a/c. The initial estimate to remove the engine; do a 30,000 mile service; replace the shocks; reseal the a/c compressor and charge the a/c, along with replacing the brake hoses and the heater and cooling system hoses was well over \$12,000 dollars.

And this was an unusually nice, no stories, one-owner Boxer.

The while-you're-at-it (and it's apart) list included new brake pads, a new brake power booster, brake rotors machined and the dash recovered, adding another \$6,000 dollars to the estimate, making our one-owner Boxer suddenly seem like a potential parts car!

Fortunately the sophisticated buyer accepted that the majority of the problems were common to most twenty year old Ferraris. After the usual negotiations a compromise was reached, an equitable split for repairs was made; a purchase agreement was signed and payment was made. The buyer chose to apply the price reduction to a 30,000 mile service, hoses, brakes, etc, as outlined in the previous paragraphs.

The degree of comprised split on the purchase of most Ferraris is a matter of the sellers motivation to sell and willingness to accept less than was anticipated combined with the buyers desire to own the car and pay a little more than expected. Add in the brokers experience, ability to explain the problems and negotiation skills to justify his meager yet humble commission and the gap between expectation and reality known as deferred maintenance versus deal killers can usually be resolved.

The buyer must accept that an 84 Boxer is worth about \$75,000 and regardless of how much money he puts into this Boxer, it will remain a \$75,000 car. The \$12,000 spent on service and \$6,000 on brakes will enhance the new owners driving pleasure, driving safety and emotional peace of mind, but... he still has a \$75,000 Boxer and any money spent over \$75,000 falls into the trade-off between peace of mind and diminishing returns.

The three key elements to a successful purchase are first, a pre-purchase inspection that tells all involved exactly what potential problems all are dealing with, secondly an understanding on the buyer's part that these are just used cars that almost always need immediate postpurchase service work and third, the acceptance that most of the money spent beyond the purchase price will never be recovered and becomes a diminishing return. Expect your used Boxer to need the minimal maintenance of a Mercedes and you'll be disappointed. Expect it to need an infusion of love and more than a few dollars to return it to its as new condition, and you'll be rewarded with a terrific ride. SF


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
Swap Meet at Ferrari and Maserati of Orange County

URGENT LEGISLATIVE ALERT

Legislation to Repeal Old Car Emissions Exemption Reintroduced in California State Assembly

Here we go again! As predicted, legislation has been reintroduced in the California Assembly to repeal the state's current rolling emissions test exemption for vehicles 30 years old and older. A.B. 2683 repeals the current pro-hobbyist exemption and replaces it with a provision requiring the permanent testing of all pre-1976 vehicles. This year, the bill was introduced by California State Assemblywoman Sally Lieber (D-District 22).

We Urge You to Contact Assemblywoman Lieber and Your Own State Assembly Member immediately to oppose A.B. 2683. Existing law in California exempts all vehicles 30-years old and older from emissions testing. California's current emissions testing exemption recognizes the minimal impact of vehicles 30-years old and older on vehicle emissions and air quality.

Vehicles 30-years old and older constitute a small portion of the overall vehicle population and are a poor source from which to look for emissions reduction. Antique and classic vehicles are overwhelmingly well-maintained and infrequently driven (about one-third the miles each year as a new vehicle).

Legislators and regulators are feeling the heat from a failed effort to meet air quality goals and are looking for a convenient scapegoat. The old car hobby should not carry the burden of their mistakes!


