





morning.

The threat of rain yielded to clear skies and bright sunshine for the Friday morning start. The course this year followed a coastal route avoiding freeways to the maximum possible extent. A run up Pacific Coast Highway and into the Topa Mountains brought the group to its first rest stop in Montecito where participants from the Ventura and Santa Barbara area joined the group. Continuing through the San Marcos Pass and along the shore of Lake Cachuma, the group proceeded to a lunch stop in Santa Ynez at Trattoria Grappolo. The restaurant staff awaited our arrival with reserved parking immediately in front of the restaurant and half of the tables set aside for a quality Italian luncheon that was enjoyed by all.

From Santa Ynez we proceeded onward through the back roads of Foxen Canyon to Santa Maria where we necessarily jumped onto the 101 for a few brief miles to Arroyo Grande. From there it was all back roads into San Luis Obispo and the Apple Farm Inn where reserved parking and a cordial staff awaited our arrival. After freshening up or relaxing in front of the fireplace in each guest room, the opening dinner at the 1865 restaurant provided a private room where participants could relive the spirited drive of the day over perfect roads

unblemished by the storm that did finally arrive on Saturday.

Although rain was with us on Saturday morning, it did little to interfere with our activities for that day. The day began with a short run to the Edna Valley Vineyard where the group enjoyed a 90 minute Wine Seminar by Winemaker Harry Hansen, a beautifully prepared luncheon paired with 6 wines and a tour of the winery. Although most had participated in wine seminars before, everyone agreed this was unlike any they had previously attended. Winemaker, Harry Hansen rarely conducts these seminars and he seemed to be enjoying himself as much as any of the participants. Because of his complete knowledge of winemaking, all questions could be answered with whatever level of comprehensiveness the group was able to accept. The seminar was complimented by a room with a view of rolling vineyards with the hills across the Edna Valley in the background. It was against this background that the group watched the weather clear for a dry afternoon and following day when dry was what was needed.

At the conclusion of activities at the Edna Valley Vineyard, a group of enthusiastic drivers together with their navigators headed north to Santa Margarita and then east across Highway 58 into the San Joaquin Valley. This route offered a challenging 175 mile round trip as a method for building up both an inventory of new stories as well as an appetite for the dinner ahead.

That evening, dinner was again in a private room at Café Roma. Conversation on this occasion reflected upon the day at Edna Valley and plans for the return home the following day. Those with other commitments planned a direct return by way of the 101. Others chose a return across Highway 58 into the Valley and then over Highway 33 for a lunch stop in Ojai. From there it was down Highway 150 to Santa Paula and through Balcom Canyon to Moorpark where the group rejoined the 101 in Westlake for the final leg home.

Veterans of last year's Gourmet Ride enjoyed this year's event for being different from before. Newcomers joined together with the Veterans in looking forward to what next year might have in store. It was promised that the drive would continue to follow its theme as the Season Opening first Drive of Spring to the Central Coast Wine Region with a Gourmet touch. It was also promised that a new destination and different main event would again be central to that theme. **SF** What a day and what a run we had. 
